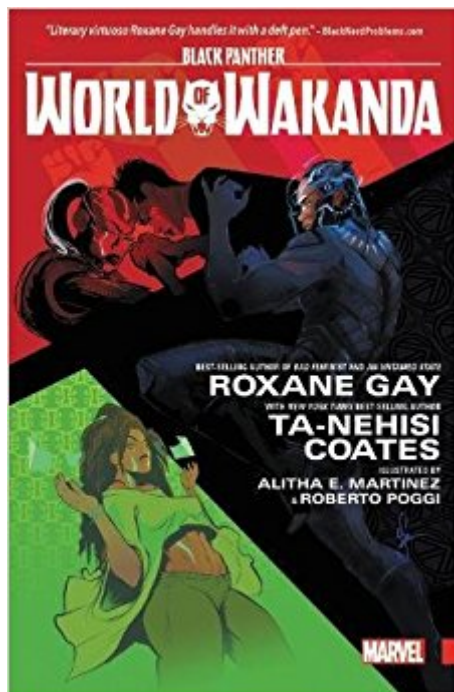


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Black Panther: World Of Wakanda

Totally got into this and went back to my computer to subscribe, but found out it has been canceled. We can't have nice things.

What happened? How did Roxanne Gay, author of the fantastic *Untamed State*, and Coates, author of *The Moving Image*, team up to write this dumpster fire of a book? No wonder this was cancelled, I can't remember the last comic I read that failed so spectacularly. *World of Wakanda* is dominated by a prequel to the current Black Panther comic focusing on the Dora Milaje, the female special forces of Wakanda. The two soldiers, Aneka and Ano, fall in love and try to hide it against the backdrop of Marvel crossover events. So let's get right into why this book is awful: every character, every single character, is horribly incompetent in every aspect of their lives. In general, they pick meaningless fights no military would allow, refuse to explain their actions, and fight like idiots. To give spoiler details: Ano constantly tries to one up her captain, which should have gotten her fired for insubordination. Aneka keeps their romance on the down low, even though people already know and don't have a problem with it. Black Panther fails to explain to his people that he can't protect Wakanda specifically because he's saving the entire planet. The queen of Wakanda does nothing when the Dora Milaje mutiny. After hearing that the chief of village is imprisoning women and raping them, that girl's daughter flips out refusing to believe it. Aneka then kills this man in cold blood, instead of bringing him to trial to prove what he did. Black Panther himself is so incompetent at ruling that he allowed situations like this to spring up all over the country. Daughter from previous complaint tries to kill the Dora Milaje in revenge and fails, but they let her run away. Later she kills their captain because the captain went after her with no backup. Throw a bunch of corny on-the-nose dialogue that would not look out of place in the 60's and baffling art panels with characters making ridiculous poses and you have this comic. But hey the White Panther one shot was okay. Don't buy, is what I'm saying.

If this series didn't get cancelled, this would be an EASY recommendation. Great artwork, unique storyline that you won't see anywhere else in comics and the writing backs all of it up. My issue is that: 1. The main storyline is really issue 1-4 in this book and issues 5 & 6 are subplots of new characters (who if I had to guess, would have been integrated into the main story in later issues). 2.
