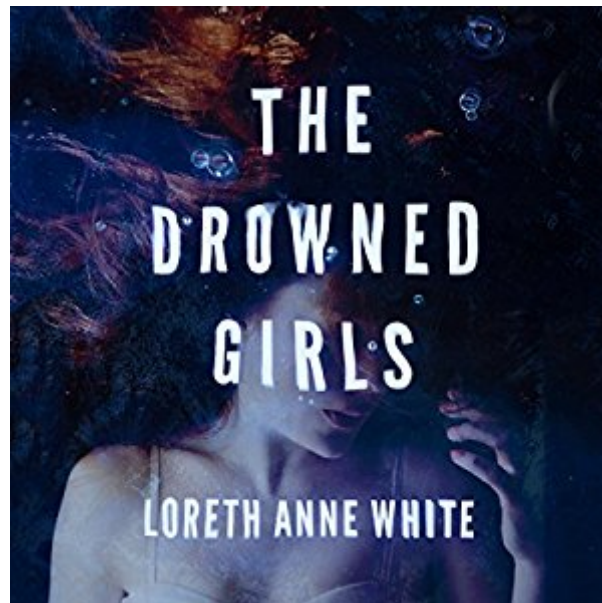




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The Drowned Girls: An Angie Pallorino Novel, Book 1



Synopsis

I just discovered this author in November, but I quickly became a fan...this is the seventh book of hers that I've read (In the Barren Ground is still my favorite). I'm glad this is the beginning of a series, because Angie is a very interesting character. On one hand, she's a competent detective, on the other hand, her personal life is a hot mess. And while some of Angie's past comes to light in this

book, there are still lots of questions that I hope will be answered in subsequent books. Angie's one night stand with a random guy has big ramifications when she discovers that this guy is her new partner/superior. While I liked James a little more as the book went on, I found him a bit too judgmental (why do women get judged so much more harshly for having sex lives?) and possessive. For that matter, Angie was a little too harsh on herself in regards to her sex life. And speaking of, if explicit sex scenes bother you, be warned, there are some in this book. As for the case, it definitely kept my interest, taking lots of twists and turns: Sex trafficking, tabloid journalism, political and police corruption. The ending was pretty pulse pounding too. There were a couple of threads that wound up not going anywhere (the priest, the guy at the shelter) and they felt unfinished to me. The priest especially seemed shady. The supporting characters were great too, I look forward to more of them. I will definitely be reading the next book.
