


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# Scenic Driving Wyoming (Scenic Driving Series)

When we reached the Dead Indian pass in NW WY (Chief Joseph Scenic Highway) and saw the 360 degree panorama of snow capped mountain ranges we felt we were in a different world. All the Big Horn Mountain roads are to die for and they have guardrails for the mountain weary traveler, a great bonus for someone just starting out. Aspen Alley, pictured on the front of the book, seems like something from a movie and does feel like an outdoor cathedral in everyway, and again when we were there we had it all to ourselves. If my wife and I could go back in time, we would have been married there, under the golden aspen trees. I could go on and on, but if you can get this book filled with culture, history, side roads, maps, and great road information for \$7 like I did, grab it and go get a rental car. Your eyes will be filled with some of the most beautiful treasures on Earth.
