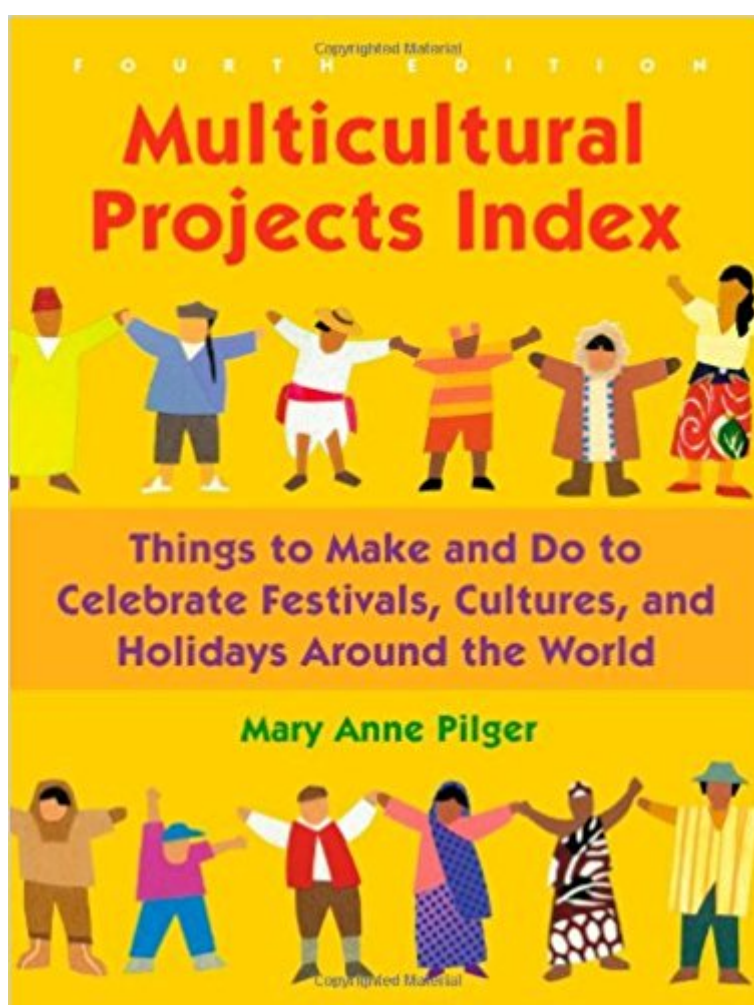


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Multicultural Projects Index: Things To Make And Do To Celebrate Festivals, Cultures, And Holidays Around The World, 4th Edition
