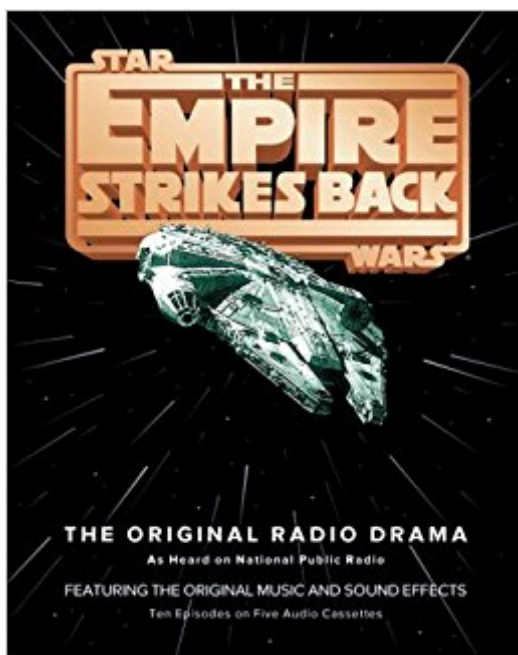

Perhaps you think the Star Wars trilogy cannot be fully realized with audio alone. You think you'd miss the stunning visuals, the emotions of the actors, and the special effects. You think it would be a disappointment. As Yoda might say, "So impossible is it? So certain are you?" This production of The Empire Strikes Back was created by the same team that produced National Public Radio's amazingly successful presentation of Star Wars: The Original Radio Drama in 1981. Presented in 10 episodes, the longer format allows for a great expansion of the story and new scenes--though purists may be disappointed by the slight but significant change in the story line while the Rebels

are on Hoth. Once again, Mark Hamill and Anthony Daniels are on hand to reprise their roles as Luke Skywalker and C-3PO, and this time they are joined by Billy Dee Williams reprising his part as Lando Calrissian. A fine cast performs the rest of the roles, notably John Lithgow as Yoda and the very compelling Perry King as the "slimy, double-crossing, no good swindler" Han Solo. Sound effects and John Williams's score from the movie have been remixed to help create a convincing soundscape--so good, you can really "see" the movie by listening to it. The Empire Strikes Back: The Original Radio Drama will thrill all Star Wars fans, whether or not they enjoy audiobooks. (Running time: 5 hours, 5 cassettes) --C.B. Delaney

Including the stunning music of John Williams performed by the London Symphony Orchestra, the ten episodes on five cassettes will capture the listener's imagination. I defy anyone to strap on headphones, or go for a very long drive listening to this show, and not fall right into the story itself. I might have read this decades ago, honestly I don't remember. But in reading it this last week I could hear and see the movies images and music come to life in my head. There are a couple small differences between this and the movie which makes for some interesting Easter eggs hidden in the text. Loved these books when I was a kid and the movies first came out. Enjoyed reading them again, and my kids didn't need to be pushed to read these books. You get extra details and info when you read, perhaps invented by the author, but it all follows the storyline of the movie. These books are keepers!

I was initially disappointed that Empire only comprised five discs worth of material, but after listening to it, I was more satisfied with these five than A New Hope's seven. The extra scenes really stand out this time - my favorites were the space battle intro and the scene with Han & Luke recovering in Han's cold weather shelter on Hoth. They're interesting and add to the experience, much more than those in A New Hope. Nor do they detract from the pacing. Having Billy Dee Williams on board helped it feel more authentic, especially since he is usually opposite Anne Sachs, who is perfect as Leia. Brock Peters as Vader I may just be used to at this point, but Perry King turned in a better performance as Han this time around. My only gripes are John Lithgow's Yoda voice, and Han coming off as kind of a scumbag with Leia - I lost count of how many times she told Han to let go of her!

Book is ok. Has an annoying editing flaw in that it cuts to different characters or locals but not marked by a chapter break nor blank line. One minute you're reading about Luke studying with Yoda, then the next paragraph is Han in the asteroid belt, and 2 paragraphs later you're reading about Vader. Might be a flaw in how it was ported to electronic format, but it's annoying. Writing generally was OK. Not a lot of revelation not already found in the movies. Spoiler alert: Yoda is not green in the book!

George Lucas has created a great sequel in part to an extremely talented group of screenwriters who were able to create a great way to bring Lucas' vision to life in a compelling fashion. The novelisation is somewhat sloppy from the final product with extra scenes that were never filmed or would be shown on Blu-ray/DVD deleted scenes or other special collections. B+

I meant to buy the full book and got this one by mistake because I didn't read the description. That being said, this is written on a kid reading level, and my 7 year old had virtually no problems with it (other than the made up Star Wars words that she needed help reading). It's good quality and has pictures from the movie in it to go with the story. Overall she really enjoyed reading it.
