

What a great overview of history from the beginning. (If you start with book one) This activity book has great maps and discussion questions that we use. There are many lists of resources to use with the lessons, as well as activities to draw, etc.

This activity book is livening our history program and it saves so much research and time. I like the recipes and crafts that she describes and I can not wait to do more of them with my daughter. So far she has eaten like a barbarian, made a Roman battle signum , built an edible roman building out of cookies and tore it apart like the barbarians did. I highly recommend this book. You will have to add your own history book to go along with this, this is just the lesson plan/idea book. (Usborne History of the World would be one example of the type of history book you might buy).This book has a lot of ideas and activities in it all relating to the Middle Ages. There is cooking recipes, craft ideas, coloring pages, and so on. It is very comprehensive.The one Negative Comment. It is very big and very thick. A large part of this is because it gets into the very basic ideas that most people do not need help remembering. That is, it provides a list of questions for each subject and page read. The questions are very basic and many of them you could think of yourself. However, this would be helpful for a first time home school mother who is not sure where to start.Well worth the money. Enjoy.

I am not very creative and relied heavily on the suggestions put forth in the book. Now I teach at a middle school and find myself turning again to these wonderful books to supplement our own dry textbooks.

This is a great activity book to go along with SOTW book two. Lots of review questions, activities, notebooking pages and supplemental reading suggestions. I was looking for something to go along with our study of the text and couldn't be happier. Great for all ages. Fantastic resource.
