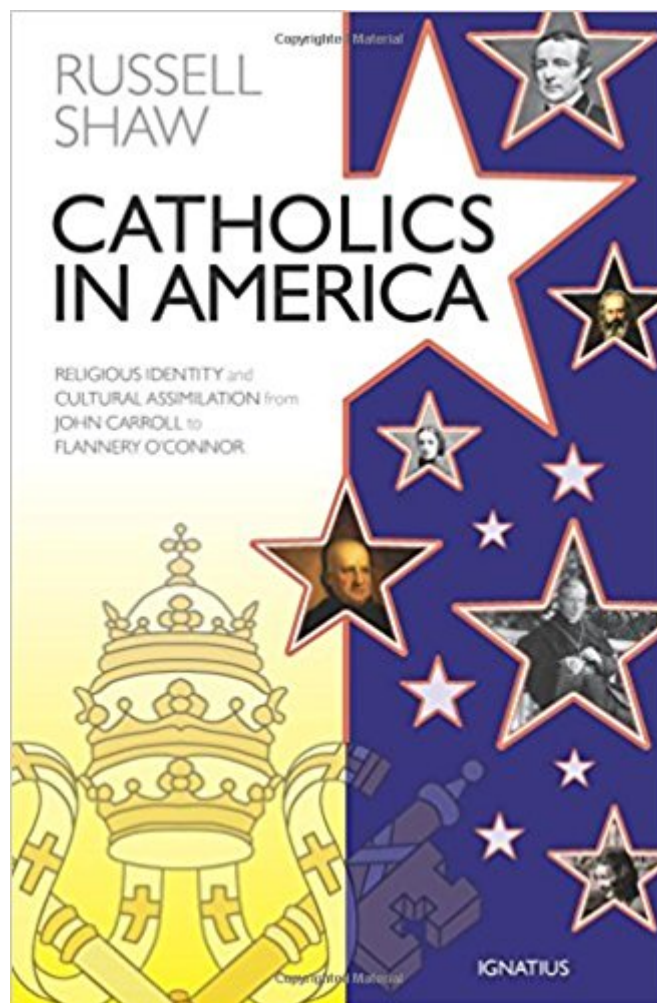

Catholics In America: Religious Identity And Cultural Assimilation From John Carroll To Flannery O'connor



Synopsis

This book is a collection of popularly written profiles of some of the leading figures in American Catholic history. The group includes Archbishop John Carroll, Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, Orestes Brownson, Cardinal James Gibbons, Al Smith, Dorothy Day, Cardinal Francis Spellman, President John F. Kennedy, and others. But this book is more than a historical survey of prominent personalities. *Catholics in America* explores the ongoing, often controversial, effort of Catholics to work out their identity in a secular, and sometimes hostile, society. Taken together, the chapters pose a fundamental challenge to the conventional wisdom of Catholic Americanist historiography, which takes cultural assimilation for granted. The oldest question in the history of the Catholic Church in the United States may be this: "Is it possible to be a good Catholic and a good American?" This book documents the variety of answers that have been given to date and demonstrates that the question is timelier now than ever before.

Russell Shaw is a widely published author and journalist who has written over twenty books, including *American Church and Nothing to Hide: Secrecy, Communication, and Communion in the Catholic Church*. For 18 years, Shaw directed media relations for the National Conference of Catholic Bishops and the United States Catholic Conference. From 1987 to 1997 he oversaw media relations for the Knights of Columbus.

A quick read, Shaw really dives into the lives of some great American Catholics. Really enjoyed it.

Russell Shaw's book is excellent for two reasons. First, he provides short, solid and cogent biographies of fifteen important Catholics from the United States. Many readers may find themselves wanting to dig further. Moreover, he does so in a way that sheds needed light on perhaps the central challenge of Catholics in the United States at this time, that is, whether or not or the degree to which one should assimilate into the surrounding culture. Shaw knows there is no simple answer to that question, but uses the biographies as a way of showing how famous Catholics in the past dealt with the issue. Shaw is clearly critical of the assimilationist perspective without serious qualifications. Readers will find much to ponder as they consider how famous Catholics in the past dealt with the challenges of maintaining Catholic identity in the midst of the evolving culture in the United States. Highly recommended!
