This little book (about 4" x 5") - is a beautiful survey of some of the loveliest stores in Florence. The majority of the stores are smaller stores or local brands (significant quality) vs big name brands known to most shoppers. Each store gets 2 pages in the book - one for the description and the other for an interior photo. The stores featured are all something special, and the cover is a perfect wrapper for what's inside. It doesn't read like a catalog, rather a review of some of Florence's best treasures. From Tip Tap (an adorable kids shoe store) to a Farmacia that will custom create perfume ... the only down side is the quick realization it will be nearly impossible to visit all these places. I would have loved to have seen this coordinate with a map so it could help me plan my shopping a bit, but otherwise it's pretty great.
