

Eloise Jarvis McGraw was an American author of children's books and young adult novels. She won the Newbery Honor three times in three different decades, for her novels *Moccasin Trail* (1952), *The Golden Goblet* (1962), and *The Moorchild* (1997). *A Really Weird Summer* (1977) won an Edgar Award for Best Juvenile Mystery from the Mystery Writers of

America. McGraw had a very strong interest in history, and among the many books she wrote for children are *Greensleeves*, *The Seventeenth Swap*, and *Mara, Daughter of the Nile*. A Lewis Carroll Shelf Award was given to *Moccasin Trail* in 1963. She also contributed to the Oz series started by L. Frank Baum; working with her daughter, graphic artist and librarian Lauren Lynn McGraw, she wrote *Merry Go Round in Oz* (the last of the Oz books issued by Baum's publisher) and *The Forbidden Fountain of Oz*.
