

Born and raised in India to English parents, Paul was determined never to become a doctor like his

father, Jesse. He was nine years old before he took his first trip â» home. That was also his first time wearing shoes! Kids will love the description of the Guinea Worm removal! EEK! Paul found being sent to school in England with his sister, Connie, along with living with his aunt and uncle hard. This was made even more difficult when Jesse, his father, died at the age of 44! Would Paul's mom come back â» home to England or stay in India? With school finished it was time to learn a trade to enable Paul to go to the mission field. After five years learning the building trade, Paul was surprised to be turned down by the missionary society who instead said that he needed to take a one year's tropical medicine course. Following that Paul was sent to the â» Colony to train for two years. It was here that Paul realized his mistake: he was not called to be a Bible teacher or a builder but a DOCTOR! Who was Paul paired with on his first day of medical school later becoming his wife? If you have not yet read the story of Ida Scudder founder of a hospital and college in Vellore, Southern India, I highly recommend you doing so as this is where Paul ended up! Having just figured out a non-surgical cure for club foot, would meeting lepers open Paul's eyes and give him the desire to find a solution for clawed hands with no feeling and fingers that eventually dropped off? Who would give Paul her savings of 500 pounds in order to start building the New Life Centre (Nava Jeeva Nilayam), a place where young men could learn a new trade. Why was this SO important? This is truly an amazing story. One man, called by God, with grit and determination, went beyond the call of duty to delve into the symptoms of leprosy, traveling all over the world to help try to understand why leprosy did what it did to its victims. Sadly, many times, he realized professionals were clueless or uncaring. I think it can be said that without Paul Brand's relentless research, leprosy would still be a huge problem today. As it stands though, Paul shed a whole new light on the disease, coming up with many different cures, taking away the stigma and solving many of the problems. FANTASTIC!
