

Milton Hershey was a great entrepreneur. He came from a poor family and ended up one of the richest people in the United States. Hershey started one of the world's most famous chocolate companies, and he used his money to help others. He wasn't successful right away, and began experimenting making milk chocolate in 1895. In 1900 he introduced the Hershey's bar, and in 1907 he created the Hersheypark as a place to have picnics. Hershey and his wife were never able to have children, so they opened a school for orphan boys and today the school also accepts girls. Each year, it serves about 1,900 children from struggling families. Hershey's produces over one billion pounds of chocolate product

annually. Milton Hershey worked hard to achieve his dreams. He never gave up, even when faced with failure. He always gave help to his workers and others who had less than he did. His generosity continues to live on.

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
