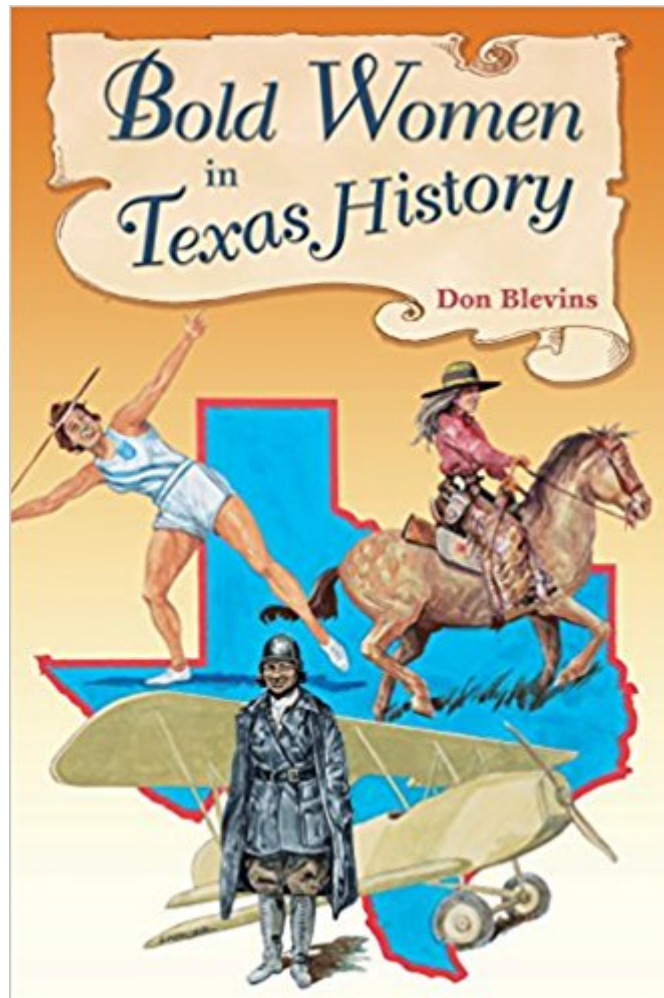

Second lady number two was Elisabet Ney, German born sculptor who was strange, disliked conservative living, was a gifted sculptor who sculpted two Texas famous legislators. Elisabet had a loving husband, not so loving son. Third Lizzie Johnson Williams liked to work hard, make money, became wealthy, married late in life to a man who had problems with honest and work. But she loved him. She was a cattle queen, unusual in a woman. She became wealthy with all her ventures. Lady eleven, Barbara Jordan, a brilliant student, became a lawyer, never married, had a great public career, was the first black woman from the South elected to Congress. She died at 60 from several health problems. Lady ten, Babe Didrikson Zaharias, a great athlete in all sports, she loved sports, was a tomboy, cocky, rough and tough. She was an athlete when it was not popular for a lady to be interested in sports. She died at 45 of cancer. Lady eight, Bessie Coleman wanted to fly planes. A young black woman, she went to France to take flying lessons. She was not allowed to take these lessons in the United States. She loved flying and was killed when her plane crashed. She was only 34. Lady seven Jovita Idar was a journalist who wrote against prejudice. She was also a teacher, worked as a nurse and was active in politics. She did much for Mexicans. Lady four, Molly Kirkland Bailey came from wealth. She ran away from a private school, married, went into show business, had nine children, spied for the south, owned a circus plus did so many other things. she lived life to its fullest as did all these other ladies. Number five was Clara Driscoll, born into wealth who was instrumental in saving the Alamo. She donated much of her money toward buying the Alamo and restoring it to what it once was and should be again. This was to be for the use and benefit of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas to be make a park of. This lady had many other accomplishments. The Alamo is much visited. Lady six was Minnie Fisher Cunningham who taught school, then attended college and became a pharmacist. She quit because men were paid more. She worked toward women's rights plus other issues that needed to be worked on. Lady nine was Oveta Culp Hobby whose family worked much in public life and affairs. She was a hard working woman, first woman to be Secretary of the Department of Health,

Education and Welfare. She was much involved in government and started the WAACs. She did so much for the government and had many honors. This book gives short histories about ladies who did so much to help Texas and its citizens plus the rest of this great country.
