

Be careful in choosing this book, some of the language is definitely dated and the term "mentally retarded" is used in each provided lesson. If you are able to understand that this term is used in the technical sense as appropriate to 1984 and look at the information offered this can be a very handy book. There are 50+ lessons presented and each one has accommodations described for 7 different impairments and ability levels. There is also a section with photographs for sign language prompts, another describing how to adapt materials and tools for use by students and yet another to describe how to manage classroom and field trips for best learning impact. Be ready to apply a modern translation but worth a closer look

Of all the books I ever had to buy for a college class, this is the one that has been the most useful and that I have referred back to the most over the years. If you teach special needs children at all, this book is immensely helpful. It has accommodations for a variety of different needs, from emotional needs to gifted learners.
