

Victor Zuckerkandl (1896-1965), born in Vienna, came to the United States in 1940 and taught at

Wellesley College, The New School, and St. John's College in Annapolis, where he developed the new approach to music presented in this book. His publications include *Sound and Symbol: Music and the External World* Princeton/Bollingen, 1969). A continuation of *Sound and Symbol* was completed before his death. It has been translated by Norbert Guterman and published as *Man the Musician* (Bollingen XLIV:2).

This book is a clear teacher that helps you learn to read a musical score. You learn the basics of western music theory and then apply that knowledge to following your favorite concerto or opera scores.
