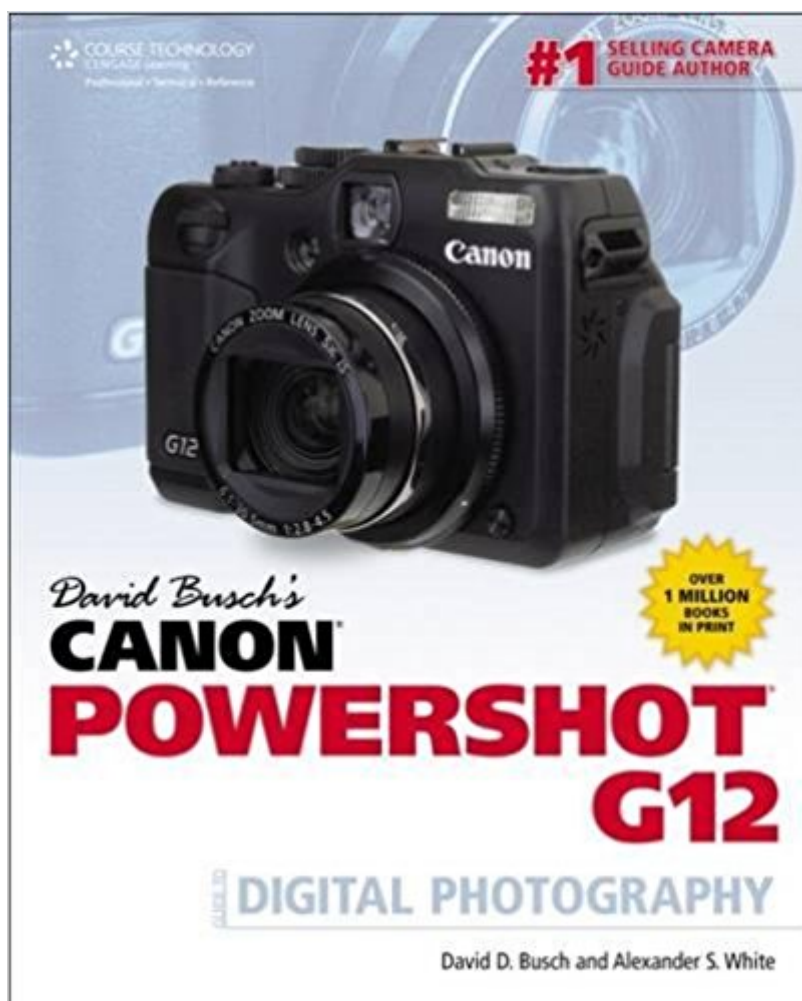

This publication was recommended in a photography forum specifically for owners of this particular camera. Took a chance and order it. Definitely was not disappointed. This book is a must have for anyone who wants to learn the ins and outs of this camera. The camera functions are explained in great detail. Photos of the actual menu settings, and screen shots of actual photos being taken enhance the users understanding of the topic. One of my reasons for purchasing this camera is the ability to shoot HDR (high dynamic range). Not only does David Busch explain what HDR is, he goes further to provide more in-depth discussion of this subject. Another + for this book is the topic of Lens Add-Ons. The author not only covers Canon brand add-ons, but also includes OEM add-ons (other equipment manufacturer). This gives the reader additional choices for purchasing add-ons that the reader may not have known about prior to reading this publication. I have owned both Canon and OEM add-ons that work as well or better than the original manufacturer brand.

Specific add-ons include conversion lens adapter and tele-converter adapter. David Busch also ties in the use of filters in this topic. I could continue here but I think you get the point! This book is a must have for anyone serious about learning this camera! I have purchased publications of this type in the past, but this one has far exceeded my expectations. Please note that I am not affiliated with Canon or with this book's author. I am a photographer looking to understand my new camera.

Remarkable book tailored for the G12 (which is a remarkable camera). MORE than 99% of users would ever want, or need to know, but it's ALL there should you need it!

Purchasing, or just purchased the Canon G12? And you are either new to photography, or the Program - Aperture priority - Shutter speed priority - Manual modes (i.e. you have owned point&shoots)? Then you are the ideal audience. Those of you who are familiar w. PASM, or who have owned other Canon 'G' series cameras will find the book useful, but not to the same degree as the first group. It does NOT go into heavy depth on such things as the HDR scene mode, difference between 'Program' mode & fully automatic (look at one of the forum discussions on the DPReview website for that), or using the custom white balance. But it makes Canon's manual look pathetic. Finished reading it over a week ago, so I'm using it as a reference: Index is very good; common to have to cross reference topics in different parts of the part, but at least it is straight forward. Why buy this book, instead of printing out the G12 manual? Depth of information! Examples: When should you use Image Stabilization? When should you turn Image Stabilization off? Why would I use 2nd curtain sync? Why should I ever adjust the EV Compensation dial? (Author provides photographic examples.) With this, don't throw the .PDF manual; this book complements it, but doesn't replace it

completely. What could improve it? An appendix which would include a table of ALL options & which shooting modes they are available to. Though Program mode is covered, why do I want to use it instead of automatic? When using Aperture priority, why do I lose sharpness when I go for maximum DOF? Planning on doing lots of video? Coverage is weak, but then so is the G12.

This my only reference book for my new camera. It is pretty good. There are some subjects that are not covered, however. I wasted an hour or more trying to find the Sepia function. By trial and error, I discovered that Sepia is only available in certain settings. I wish the book had provided more information on functions.

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
