

By this, I don't just mean wins and losses, but, more importantly, a winning and healthy culture. This is a program built with players who, for the most part, stay for four years and graduate. There aren't any lottery picks on this team. We get to learn about these players in this book. This is a program that focuses on process and being the best that they can be. A lot of coaches preach this, but you get the sense that Jay Wright really believes this--and that his players believe it too. Championships are "the icing on the cake," but what's really important is preparing and playing the right way and understanding the importance of commitment to one another on a team.
