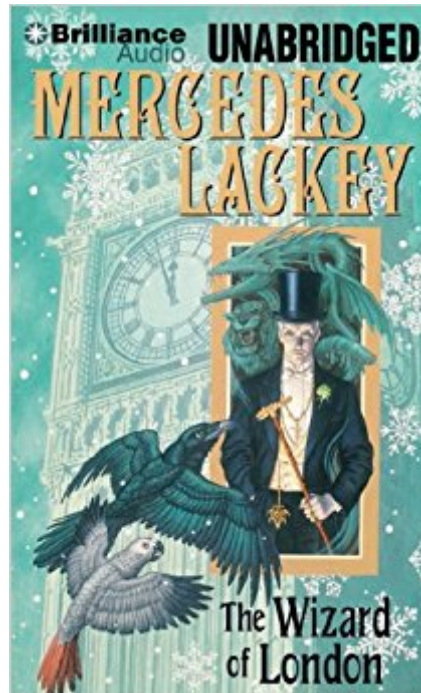

Lackey's latest Elemental Masters novel is set in Victorian England. The Harton School for Boys and Girls, run by Isabelle and Frederick Harton, is one of the few schools that takes students whose magic doesn't pertain to the elements, and who are, therefore, frequently ignored by the Elemental Masters. Such unheeded gifts include clairvoyance, telepathy, and the very rare ability to truly communicate with the dead. Sarah Jane's parents, missionary healers in Africa, send the 12-year-old to Harton, and she is happy there, especially after she befriends Nan, a street urchin. After an attempt is made on Sarah and Nan's lives, it is clear that a powerful Elemental Master wants one or both girls dead. Isabelle Harton must seek the aid of the Elemental Masters of London, though the Masters' Circle is led by Lord Alderscroft, who once cruelly jilted her. The title character is not the protagonist, in a fascinating twist. The story is really that of two magical children, learning to deal with their respective talents in a school for special children. We would all have wished to live at such a free school, where children are respected and loved! Mercedes Lackey always brings in different cultures, different points of view. This book is rich in images and the colors of many beliefs.

I liked the book in general, especially the addition of the non-Elemental wizards, but I had some definite problems given the other books in the series. Given Lord Alderscroft's experiences in this one, it doesn't make sense for him to have refused female members. I don't want to give away spoilers, but you do have to suspend a little more disbelief than usual for his part of the story. The girls, Sarah and Nan, are great, though, as is Memsab, and the subsidiary characters.

To me this series combines the best of all Mercedes work-- magic and all its legends; the ethics of thinking people; her predilection for finding a simple sturdy hero in dire circumstances and transporting that young person to a life where love transforms the young person and those around them. Retelling old fairy tales has its own magic. The legend of the Snow Queen now seems to have a basis in more than Hans Christian Anderson's imagination it has been woven into an older tradition. As for this particular tale it is about two remarkable little girls, their remarkable bird companions and a group of warriors who you want to hear more and more about. Hope she revisits these characters more closely in the future.

Mercedes Lackey has yet again written an amazing, thoroughly engaging story that keeps you flipping pages so fast I think they need to create a new diagnosis for sore wrists called turningthepageitis.

heart of ice, a beautiful yet evil Air Master, two psychically gifted young girls and their pets that are more than just pets, the Headmistress and staff of a rather unique boarding school, and possibly the oldest great power in the British Isles. As usual, Mercedes Lackey spins a yarn that is engaging and entertaining. One can truly believe that Great Britain at the beginning of the Twentieth Century was a land of magic and ancient mystical creatures.

I think this is my favorite of the "Elemental Masters" books, I have certainly read it more often than the others. I think it is the school setting, the non-elemental powers that are added and the use of many well produced viewpoints that really brings it all together for me.

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
